## **Guildford Coal Limited donates \$100,000 to flood recovery**

Queensland coal explorer Guildford Coal Limited today announced that it would donate a total of \$100,000 toward recovery efforts in disaster affected communities across the state of Queensland.

Guildford Coal is an emerging coal explorer with assets across the Galilee, Maryborough and Bowen Basins. It was listed on the ASX in July 2010.

Chairman of Guildford Coal Tony Bellas said the company operated in many of the regional communities affected by the floods, including towns such as Bundaberg, Rockhampton and Emerald.

Mr Bellas said Guildford Coal's focus was on funding locally based recovery programs in partnership with not-for-profit organisations.

"Guildford Coal will work with organisations such as Mission Australia to support residents as they recover, and provide vital outreach services in regional and rural communities," Mr Bellas said.

"Our contribution acknowledges the extraordinary nature of the floods and the damage across Queensland. It is about providing immediate and personalised support to help get people back on their feet.

"Our thoughts continue to be with families who have suffered in recent weeks from a disaster from which they will take many months and years to recover."

## Support for flood victims

LAST night staggering support came from the North Queensland Fury and the club's corporate backers for those affected by the deadly floods which hit the state earlier this month.

And now it seems the club – which is on its financial knees at the same time that it's driving a fundraising campaign – could also receive a handy boost at the eleventh hour of its A-League life.

Until last night chairman of Guildford Coal, Tony Bellas, had never seen a game of soccer live and yet he took centre stage at Dairy Farmers Stadium when he tipped \$100,000 into the Townsville-based club's fundraising effort for the floods.

Players and Fury staff kicked off the appeal with

\$5000 of their own, and by the end of the night the support of the club's financial backers – including \$20,000 from their major partner Mission Australia – had brought the total to \$140,000.

And together they have hinted that the Fury, which needs to raise \$1.5 million by the end of the month to secure a future in the nation's top competition, could become a long-term interest.

"Guildford Coal and the Fury have been in discussions about other business opportunities, however, today's donation is something very special and will certainly help thousand of people as they try to recover from the worst natural disaster this country has ever seen," Fury boss Rabieh Krayem said.
